After two URBIO conferences and 2 years of the URBIO network it seems to be time to develop a stronger structure and involve more people in the activities of the network.

In the moment all activities except the preparation of the URBIO conference are organized by Prof. Müller (holding the contact with the CBD and URBIO members, exchange information on latest developments in urban biodiversity and design and oncoming conferences and distribute the URBIO Newsletter). He is supported by his his staff; latter in general 1 day every week for holding the web site, registering new persons for the newsletter and managing the list of members.

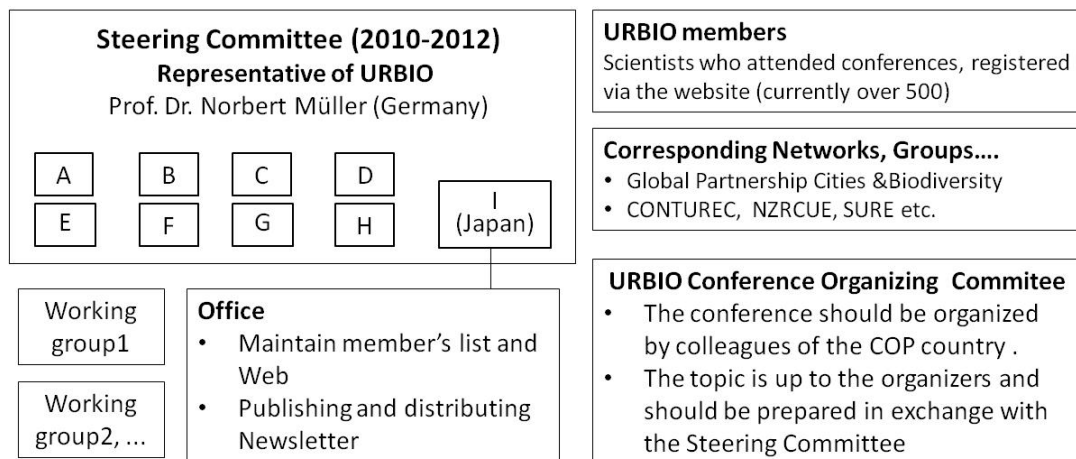
1. Aims and works

URBIO is an open worldwide Network for education and research promoting “Urban Biodiversity and Design” through the continuing dialogue with the CBD. At the first URBIO conference 2008, the participants decided to have future scientific meetings (conferences or workshops every second year in front of the COP meetings) and to exchange research activities and results in Urban Biodiversity and Design.

2. Structure

The URBIO Network is establishing a steering committee and an office. It can set working groups, depending on its necessity. The steering committee proposes the further direction of URBIO and it is the advisory board for the office. The office governs member list, website and newsletter. The newsletter should be distributed every 2 months.

Scientists of the country of COP meetings will prepare an URBIO conference in front of COP, bring the results to COP and take the network office and duties (newsletter, contact to the members and Cities group) for two years until the next URBIO conference and then it will change again

3. Activities

3.1 URBIO meetings

The URBIO conferences or workshops should be organized by colleagues in the host country of the COP meetings. The conference topics are up to the organizers in exchange with

the steering committee.

3.2 Contact between the CBD and the scientists

To hold the contact to the CBD, URBIO is involved in the Global partnership for “Cities and Biodiversity”. The representative of URBIO and some of the members of Steering Committee should attend the telephone conferences (every two months) where information is exchanged and the topics according urban biodiversity for the next COP are prepared. The results of these meeting are distributed via the newsletter.

3.3 Exchange of information via the website

Latest scientific information on the subject urban biodiversity and design should be distributed via the newsletter in an average every 2 months. The office should collect information to be shared by the URBIO members and steering committee, through web and distributing the URBIO newsletter. The office also has to manage member’s list.
